

WHAT ARE IN-DEMAND JOBS?

In-demand jobs are jobs that have a sustainable wage and a promising future based on the projected number of openings and growth. Ohio has in-demand jobs in more than **200 occupations** across a wide range of industries. The state's In-Demand Jobs List was developed using labor market information, job postings on **OhioMeansJobs.com**, JobsOhio regional forecasts and employer forecasts. WHAT IS IN-DEMAND JOBS WEEK?

In-Demand Jobs Week is a statewide celebration of jobs, industries and skills that are in-demand in Ohio. Communities statewide are encouraged to partner to plan engaging events and activities that will inspire excitement and awareness among students and job seekers. The inaugural In-Demand Jobs Week is May 7-11, 2018, and will occur annually thereafter during the first full work-week in May.

FOR EDUCATORS

In-Demand Jobs Week is an opportunity to inspire students by focusing on in-demand careers and pathways in the classroom and beyond.

FOR EMPLOYERS AND WORKFORCE PROFESSIONALS

In-Demand Jobs Week is an opportunity to open your doors to students and job seekers to increase interest in local jobs and build a talent pipeline.

FOR COMMUNITIES

In-Demand Jobs Week is an opportunity to identify like-minded stakeholders to partner, plan events and increase awareness about jobs available in the community.

INSPIRE YOUR STUDENTS TO LEARN ABOUT AND PURSUE IN-DEMAND JOBS!

Today's students likely will hold jobs that don't even exist today. The talent needs of businesses are changing quickly, which means workers will need to be flexible, adaptable and ready to acquire new knowledge and skills in real time. Now is a great time for business, education and workforce to come together to address skills gaps, build a talent pipeline and help students prepare for a successful journey along their career pathways.

Many students in Ohio aren't aware of the rewarding and in-demand careers available in their own communities. In-Demand Jobs Week is an opportunity for businesses, educators and workforce professionals to collaborate to inspire students and job seekers to pursue in-demand jobs in their areas.

While many communities across the state already are engaged in collaborative efforts to promote in-demand jobs, it is not happening consistently. Business, education and workforce leaders cite a common obstacle of not knowing where to begin or how to engage others. We want to help you start that conversation, so we've included a guide with suggested activities and a stakeholder map to inspire creativity and action in communities across Ohio.

We encourage you to call your local business and workforce leaders and challenge them to open their doors to students and staff. By building strong relationships and collaborating with local business and workforce leaders, you and your community will be better positioned to help students launch successful careers. Businesses build a talent pipeline, educators help students find their passions and career pathways, and students, job seekers and families benefit by finding purposeful employment in their local communities.

JOIN THE MOVEMENT. ENGAGE YOUR COMMUNITY.

CAREER EXPOSURE IDEAS

Engage with your local businesses to inspire students by:

- Scheduling Business Tours and Open Houses: Visit a workplace with students and interview employees about knowledge and skills needed in different occupations.
- Hosting a Career Fair: Organize a career fair with business partners. Encourage them to bring hands-on learning opportunities for students.
- Hosting a College Fair: Encourage college and university representatives to tell students about the majors that lead to in-demand careers.
- Creating Work-Based Learning Opportunities: Engage businesses to create
 work-based learning opportunities for students. The Ohio Department of Education has developed tools to help schools in the development and management of these opportunities.
- Using Career Connections in the Classroom: Use Ohio's Career Connections Learning Strategies to connect academic standards to career concepts.
- Scheduling Classroom Speakers: Invite business and community partners to talk to students about their career fields and industries.
- Creating Middle School Career Immersion Days: Work with local businesses to coordinate a career immersion day with hands-on, engaging activities for middle schoolers.
- Coordinating a Signing Day: Hold a signing-day event at your school where seniors announce their commitment to postsecondary programs, employment opportunities or military enlistment.
- Recognizing OhioMeansJobs-Ready Students: Formally recognize students
 who have earned the OhioMeansJobs-Readiness Seal during In-Demand
 Jobs Week and allow businesses to conduct interviews on-site with OhioMeansJobs-Ready students.
- Finding Career Mentorship Opportunities: Work with local businesses to identify potential mentorship opportunities for students.
- Conducting Informational Interviews: Ask your students to conduct informational interviews with an adult in a career of their interest.
- Organizing Service Learning: Create a service learning project for students to interact with the community and learn about careers in the service area.
- Using OhioMeansJobs K-12: Engage students in OhioMeansJobs K-12's Guided Tour to begin or continue their career exploration.

FIND LOCAL PARTNERS!

Here are some tips for making your event a success:

- Use Facebook-recognized venues and tag those venues.
- Use compelling and thorough details about your event in the description. Don't leave people guessing; be specific.
- Use keywords specific to your event in the tag under "category." Facebook recommends events to users based on their interests.
- Let people post to the event wall and interact with commenters.
